I came to cast fire on the earth...

There are moments in the Gospels when the words of the Lord unsettle us. This Sunday we hear one of them: "I have come to bring fire to the earth... Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace? No, but rather division" (Luke 12:49-53). In a world already torn apart by wars, deep social fractures, and wounds within families, these words can seem hard to reconcile with the image of Christ as Prince of Peace. A purely literal reading might even tempt us to imagine that He delights in the strife that troubles our times. Yet the Church, faithful to her Lord, understands these words very differently.

The "fire" Christ speaks of is the purifying and life-giving fire of divine charity. It is the same fire of the Holy Spirit that descended at Pentecost, consuming the hearts of the Apostles

with zeal for the Kingdom. As Pope Benedict XVI taught, "The fire of God is the transforming energy of His love, which burns away what is decayed in our lives and makes us new". This fire does not destroy for the sake of destruction but purifies so that we may live entirely for God.

Such purification inevitably demands choice. As St. John Paul II often reminded us, "The truth makes demands; it calls for conversion". When we choose the Gospel without compromise, we sometimes find ourselves misunderstood or even opposed, not because we seek division, but because the values of Christ will not always align with the values of the world.

The call to discipleship, therefore, is a summons to courage and to tenderness at once. Courage, to bear the cost of fidelity;

tenderness, to ensure that in our witness we reflect the mercy of the One we follow. St. Catherine of Siena, whose heart burned with this divine fire, urged Christians to "be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire."

In the face of the world's conflicts, our task is not to mirror its hostility, but to let Christ's fire free us from bitterness, cynicism, and fear. Then our presence will be a quiet but unmistakable sign of the peace He does not give the fragile peace of avoiding truth, but the deep reconciliation born from hearts ablaze with the love of God.
