The Vocation of Every Christian

The feast of All Saints invites us to contemplate a profound truth often obscured by the Church's formal canonisation processes: holiness is not the preserve of the exceptional few whose names appear in the liturgical calendar, but rather universal calling of every baptised Christian. Whilst the Church's official recognition of saints testifies to heroic virtue and miraculous intercession, the communion of saints extends far beyond the marble altars and gilded images of our basilicas.

Saint Paul, writing to the Corinthians, addresses the faithful not as the mediocre or the spiritually adequate, but as the sancti - the saints - calling them to recognise what they fundamentally are through baptismal incorporation into Christ. This apostolic designation reminds us that canonisation does not create sanctity; rather, the Church's solemn declarations merely confirm what grace has already wrought. The vast multitude whose names remain unknown save to God constitute the true depth of the Church's holiness.

Saint John Paul II, in his apostolic exhortation Christifideles Laici, articulated with particular clarity the "universal call to holiness," emphasising that this vocation admits of no exceptions. John Paul II reminded us that sanctity is not measured by extraordinary penances or dramatic martyrdoms alone, but by the faithful execution of ordinary duties animated by supernatural charity. In this vision, the mother caring for her children. tradesman conducting his work with integrity, and the labourer serving faithfully at his post are as truly called to the heights of Christian perfection as those whose virtue the Church has formally recognised.

Yet the saints we venerate -Saint Thomas Aguinas, Saint Teresa of Ávila, Saint John of the Cross serve an indispensable pedagogical function. They are not distant ideals but luminous witnesses to what the Christian life. lived without compromise, can achieve. Through their intercession, we do not bypass Christ our mediator, but rather we acknowledge the communion that binds us across the veil separating the Church militant from the Church triumphant. We seek their prayers precisely because they have attained what we pursue.

This feast, therefore, calls us to a double recognition: first, that we ourselves are saints in virtue of our baptismal consecration; secondly, that we are summoned to live worthily of that exalted title. The canonised saints remind us of the possibilities inherent in human nature redeemed and transfigured by grace. They are, as it were, the fullest expression of what humanity was created to become.

Blessing of the graves will take place at 3 pm on Sunday 2 November: Gathering at the gates of East Sheen Cemetery.
