Why a narrow gate?

This season of rest and holidays is gradually drawing to a close. Parents and families are beginning to return, preparing for the new academic year and the resumption of work as usual. Into this moment the Gospel offers us the striking image of the narrow door, which gathers together the themes of recent weeks: the call to vigilance, the futility of possessions, and the urgency of readiness.

At first hearing, the narrow door may sound like a passage reserved for a

chosen few, with the rest shut out in despair. The mention of weeping and gnashing of teeth seems to confirm that fear. Yet Jesus never presents the Kingdom as an exclusive members' club. The narrowness is not about limitation of space, but about the form of the journey. The narrow walk ways rubs away our excess, our pride, and our wayward habits, until we emerge refined, ready to stand among the saints.

What matters is not whether we

feel strong or weak, but whether we keep walking. The discipline of prayer, honesty in work, patience at home, fidelity in friendship - these daily choices are the chisels of grace. They are not arbitrary demands, but the means by which Christ perfects what is already planted in us.

As the demands of routine return, perhaps this is the moment to decide that our spiritual life will not be pushed aside, but woven firmly into the fabric of each day.
