Serving without counting the cost

This Sunday's Gospel offers us an image that may feel uncomfortable. Jesus speaks of a servant who comes in from the fields, only to be asked by his master to serve again at table, without thanks or reward. To modern ears, it seems harsh and unfair. Yet Jesus uses this example to teach us something vital about our relationship with God.

The parable is not about human employers and employees, but about the truth of discipleship in the face of God's greatness. We stand before the One who has given us everything: life itself, faith, hope, love, and the very breath we draw. Nothing we do could ever place God in our debt. St Augustine expressed it beautifully when he wrote, "When God crowns our merits, He crowns

nothing but His own gifts." Our good works and acts of service are themselves possible because of God's generosity.

Seen in this light, humility is not about belittling ourselves, but about living in truth. It is the recognition that our faith and our strength come from God, and that we serve not to earn a reward but because we belong to Him. This humility does not diminish our dignity. On the contrary, it sets us free. For if God owes us nothing give continues to everything, then all our service becomes a joyful response of love, rather than a calculation of what we might gain.

In a world where achievement and recognition are highly prized, Jesus invites us to a different way of living. We are called to serve without counting the cost, knowing that God's love is not measured in human terms. When we say with the Gospel, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty," these words are not meant to discourage us. They help us to see clearly that our true worth lies in belonging to God and in sharing His life.

The peace that flows from such humility is deep and lasting. It allows us to serve in parish, family, and community without needing applause, because we know the One we serve sees us and loves us. In this lies our joy: not in recognition, but in communion with the Lord who calls us His own.
