Remembrance and Dedication

There are certain days in the year when memory takes on a stillness of its own. Remembrance Sunday is such a day. In the quiet of our homes and churches, we pause to honour those who gave their lives in wars past and those who continue to serve where peace remains fragile. Their courage arose not from ambition but from a deep conviction that some things - justice, freedom, the safety of others - are worth the ultimate price. The silence we keep is heavy with meaning: it carries gratitude, grief, and the hope that we might yet find gentler ways.

Today's liturgy offers another kind of remembrance. The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica seems, at first glance, a rather different commemoration. Yet it too speaks of what endures. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of his body as the true temple, and Saint Paul

reminds us that each person is a temple of the Holy Spirit. The great basilica in Rome, ancient and venerable though it is, becomes merely a sign pointing towards something more intimate - the dwelling of God within human life itself.

This thought draws dedication remembrance and together in quiet harmony. Every life offered in conflict reminds us of what human beings are capable of when they act for something beyond themselves. The temple of stone tells us that faith seeks a home; the temple of the body reveals that God seeks one too. The same mystery runs through both - the fragile, costly hope that goodness can dwell in human hearts, even when the world seems determined to extinguish it.

Perhaps remembrance is not only about looking back, nor

dedication merely about preserving the past. Both invite us to look inward, to those places where peace either begins or falters. What kind of dwelling does God find within us? What memories are we building into the fabric of our own lives? Are we temples that shelter others, or merely monuments to our own concerns?

The answer to such questions is not given in today's readings, nor can it be spoken in a moment of silence. It can only be discovered slowly, in the choices we make after the remembering is done - in whether we become, like those we honour, living temples where the Spirit of peace might truly dwell.
